

The Centenary Celebration Concert



Northumberland C of E Academy

The Choir was founded originally in October 1916 by Mr. W. H. Batey as Ashington Male Voice Choir.

He laid the foundations of successful choral singing of a high standard winning many contests and earning a fine reputation for the Choir.

After surviving the 1926 General Strike and the Second World War, the Choir amalgamated in 1956 with the depleted Morpeth and Newbiggin Male Voice Choirs to form Ashington & District Male Voice Choir.

The Choir has entertained audiences across the region and overseas and performs a varied selection of songs. It is appropriate that several numbers are about coal mining as Ashington was once famous as 'the largest coal mining village in the world'.

Surviving the Covid pandemic, which impacted on many community choirs, this traditional male voice choir from Ashington continues to flourish and attract new members.

During 2016, the Choir had 28 members – 9 baritones, 7 basses, 6 first tenors and 6 second tenors.

Susan Robertson

Susan Robertson, who was an accomplished solo soprano, was brought up in Newbiggin by the Sea.

Living in Teesside, she was Manager of the Tees Valley Music Service but still found time for her solo work, conducting choirs, leading workshops and composing songs.

Anna Corcoran

Anna Corcoran, who was a singer songwriter and pianist, had just released her debut album.

She had been choir director and singing teacher at the Academy.

A Lasting Tribute to A Local Legend

Mike Kirkup will be remembered!

The Choir President, George Wade, paid tribute to Mike Kirkup, a former President of the Choir, in the concert programme.

Mike, who was not just famous for his publication, 'Creeful of Coals', will probably be best remembered for his work with local musician Derek Hobbs. They produced the oratorio, 'Fell 'Em Doon', which was performed at the Ashington Festival in 1994.

Pieces from the musical have become 'Coalfield Anthems' and 'The Colliers' Requiem' is recognised nationally.

Ashington & District Male Voice Choir was honoured to be asked to sing at Mike Kirkup's funeral. It was fitting that Mike left the church to 'The Colliers' Requiem' with Derek Hobbs as the Choir's accompanist.
