


A Concert Review for 2010 to 2014



Concert for Nepal in Whitley Bay

The Choir was founded originally in October 1916 by Mr. W. H. Batey as Ashington Male Voice Choir.

He laid the foundations of successful choral singing of a high standard winning many contests and earning a fine reputation for the Choir.

After surviving the 1926 General Strike and the Second World War, the Choir amalgamated in 1956 with the depleted Morpeth and Newbiggin Male Voice Choirs to form Ashington & District Male Voice Choir.

The Choir has entertained audiences across the region and overseas and performs a varied selection of songs. It is appropriate that several numbers are about coal mining as Ashington was once famous as 'the largest coal mining village in the world'.

Surviving the Covid pandemic, which impacted on many community choirs, this traditional male voice choir from Ashington continues to flourish and attract new members.



The Birth of A Pit Village


Ashington Music Society and Middlesbrough Community Choir presented the 'Fell 'Em Doon' Concerts at Northumberland C of E Academy in Ashington on the 6th and 7th July 2013.


Ashington & District Male Voice Choir was delighted to perform in and support these concerts. Neil Morton, musical director and conductor, directed the concerts.

Other performers included Susan Robertson, Richard Grady, the Academy Primary Choir, Wansbeck Male Voice Choir, The Hastings Singers (Blyth), The Wansbeck Singers, Marden Bridge Community Choir, The Newbiggin Singers, Ashington Colliery Band, Jayess Newbiggin Brass Band and Northumbrian Water Ellington Colliery Band.

The artists firstly performed a varied selection of music and then numbers from 'Fell 'Em Doon'. All songs in the musical work were produced by Derek Hobbs and Mike Kirkup.

The musical work tells the story of the birth of Ashington pit village and runs through the years to the time when all the pits closed in 1994 when it was performed in the October at the Ashington Festival.
